Entering 2025 there are countless blessings for our parish to celebrate, and even more for us to anticipate.

2024 Recap

2024 saw St. Athanasios grow in both membership and spirituality. Not since 2013 have we Baptized and Chrismated as many new Orthodox Christians (ranging in age from infants to adults) as in the past year. Likewise, the number of couples from our community that got married was the highest in the last decade. Across the country Churches are diminishing in size, yet St. Athanasios has bucked that trend by growing both sacramentally and with the number of stewards in the past year. This is surely a reflection of the work of Christ in the hearts and lives of our parishioners and the community as a whole.

Financially we met our Stewardship goal while simultaneously raising an additional \$167,000 to eliminate our parish mortgage.

Ministry in the parish and community expanded to with the addition of our Agape Senior Ministry, Soul Sisters, our women's small group ministry, the addition of local pilgrimages, and the hiring of our Youth Director.

2025 Look Ahead

The above successes will serve as the foundation for 2025 and the celebration of our parish's 60th anniversary. We would like to spend this year celebrating our history, while simultaneously laying the groundwork for our future.

In the coming months we will be publishing features of different parishioners and their experiences of St. Athanasios through our storied 60 year history. By sharing the stories of the past, we bring them into the present and honor them into the future.

We hope to build on the strong finances of the past year as we undertake our 2025 Stewardship Campaign: Your Own From Your Own with a target of \$408,300 for the year. This will run in conjunction with Phase 2 of our Capital Campaign to raise funds for long-term building projects like the our roof and parking lot replacement.



Most importantly we will continue the ministry work of the Church so "that all should be saved and come to the knowledge of truth" (1 Tim 2:4). Knowing Christ and knowing ourselves in Christ is the source of our salvation. Growing this knowledge will be the focus of our liturgical life, parish Lenten retreat, our small groups, youth programs, and all ministries. Sharing this knowledge then is the next step. As we have seen an increase in the number of Catechumens, we must make it a priority in the coming year to incorporate these new brothers and sisters in Christ into the full community of the Church and into our family lives.

I wish you all a blessed and fruitful 2025. May the Lord continue to bless us as He has so abundantly for the past 60 years.

KNOW THE SAINTS

New Icons added to the Church

Two new loons were added to the walls of the Church to commemorate two great but perhaps lesser known saints of the Church: St. Vincent the Deacon & St. Kassiani the Hymnographer.

St. Vincent

Saint Vincent is the most illustrious of the Martyrs of Spain. Because of his virtue, he was ordained deacon by Valerius, Bishop of Saragossa, who, because of his advanced age and an impediment in his speech, commissioned Vincent to be preacher of the Gospel. In 303, the impious Emperors Diocletian and Maximian sent Dacian to Spain as governor, with an edict to persecute the clergy. Saint Vincent was brought with Bishop Valerius to Valencia; the bishop was sent into exile, but the holy deacon was tortured on a rack, and after suffering other cruel torments, gave up his soul into the hands of God on January 22 in the year 304.

St. Kassiani

Saint Kassiani is a well-known Byzantine poet, who lived during the reign of Emperor Theophilos (829 – 842).

She was tonsured about the year 820, and founded a convent on Xerolophos, one of Constantinople's seven hills. There she led "an ascetic and philosophical life" which was pleasing to God. She was an energetic Igourneness who not only regulated the life of the convent, but also found time to pursue her literary interests. She combined the talents of poet, theologian and musician, writing hymns and composing musical settings for them. Originally sung by her nuns, many of her compositions have enduring value. At least twenty-three of her hymns were later included in the Church's liturgical books.

One of Saint Kassiani's most famous hymns is sung during Matins on Holy Wednesday, on the subject of the woman who had fallen into many sins, which is based on Saint Luke's Gospel (7:36-50).

Another of her hymns is sung in the Canon of Matins for Holy Saturday, and is repeated at the Midnight Office on Holy Pascha: "Do not weep for me, O Mother, beholding in the tomb the Son Whom thou hast conceived without seed in thy womb, for I shall arise..."


Soul Sisters will meet monthly on Thursday evenings in St. Matthew Hall from 7-8:30 pm. Whole group fellowship followed by small group discussions.


