

Calling to mind St. Paul's admonition "in everything give thanks" (1 Thess 5:18), St. John Chrysostom offered these final words as he ended his life: "Glory to God for all things!" We might expect a great saint of the Church to end his life in this way, with a reflection and thanksgiving for all the blessings he has received. However, the circumstances around St. John Chrysostom's falling asleep make this utterance even more powerful than they seem at first glance.

St. John was born in Antioch in the mid 4th century. There he became a priest and most prominent preacher in the city, gaining fame throughout the Byzantine Empire. He was particularly loved by the common people and the poor. When the episcopacy of Constantinople became vacant, he was brought to the capital of the empire and made Archbishop of Constantinople. There he continued to preach rousing sermons that supported the poor and needy and called the ruling elite of the capital to care for their neighbors.

No one was excluded from St. John's messages of simplicity and humility, even the empress. When Empress Eudoxia had silver statues of herself installed around the city, St. John was critical. This criticism led to St. John being exiled, then called back from exile, before finally being exiled one last time. On his second exile, St. John, who was already physically frail, was subjected to a death march from Constantinople to the eastern edge of the Black Sea. Reaching the end of his strength, St. John uttered his famous words: "Glory to God for all things!" and reposed.

Seeing how St. John Chrysostom ended his life with an outpouring of gratitude even in the midst of suffering, it is beautiful providence that we celebrate his falling asleep on November 13th, so close to the National Holiday of Thanksgiving. The example he lays down for us is that regardless of our circumstances, the glory of God never wanes. It is always appropriate to offer thanks to the Lord.

This is a lesson that was learned well in the early years of Soviet Russia. Metropolitan Tyrphon of Turkestan was a bishop residing in Moscow during some of the worst state sanctioned persecution against the Church. As he watched hundreds of thousands of Churches being confiscated or destroyed, and clergy and lay members of the Church being executed or sent off to concentrations camps, he composed a long series of hymns. He gave this new service the title -An Akathist of Thanksgiving: Glory to God for all things! Obviously through this title, Metropolitan Tryphon was hoping to invoke the spirit of St. John's gratitude. This service was unknown for many years, until it was discovered in the personal effects of Fr. Gregory Petroff, a priest who died in 1940 in a Soviet prison camp.





While the Akathist of Thanksgiving: Glory to God for All Things may have an association with perseverance in times of extreme persecution, it is replete with joy. A spirit of gratitude, awe, and wonder prevail throughout the hymn. I can think of no other piece of hymnology that so completely articulates the gratitude that God's creatures have for all that He provides.

This year in anticipation of our national day of Thanksgiving, we will be gathering as a community on Tuesday, November 26th to sing the Akathist of Thanksgiving and to render Glory to God for all things.


Parish council elections will be held on Nov 17th. Thank you to all of those that filled out the application for the election.






