

October 3rd is the feastday of St. Dionysios the Areopagite, a saint not well known outside of monasteries and the study of mystical theology. He gets his sumame "Areopagite" from the Areopagus or Mars Hill located just to the Northeast of the Parthenon on the Acropolis in Athens. It is there that St. Paul preached and brought the Gospel of Christ to the Athenians (Acts 17). St. Dionysios was one of those Athenians gathered at the Areopagus who heard St. Paul's sermon and dedicated his life to following the Lord. He eventually became the Bishop of Athens and ended his life with a martyr's crown.

A collection of deeply mystical and complex writings is attributed to St. Dionysios with one of the most famous being a reflection on the nature and role of hierarchy. St. Dionysios might even be the first Christian to use the word "hierarchy" and when he does, he doesn't have in mind what we might in terms of authority and power that is expressed in a top-down fashion. It isn't even a word he uses as a title for the Bishop, which is often how we use it now. Instead, when St. Dionysios writes about hierarchy, he writes about a diversity of gifts that all function in their proper order.

The reason for the order and structure, according to St. Dionysios, is so that each member can share the gifts that are unique to them with those next to them. In other words, if you have a particular gift or virtue, you may be placed in a position "over" someone else who does not have that same gift. But as Christ reminds His disciples, they are not to rule or execute authority over one another, but rather they are called to serve (Matthew 20:25). So as St. Dionysios explains, hierarchy is the structure and order that God establishes so that you can be properly positioned to offer your gifts in service. In his words, "For the holy constitution of the Hierarchy ordains that some are purified, others purify; some are enlightened, others enlighten; some are perfected, others make perfect; for in this way the divine imitation will fit each one."

Each person has a proper place within the hierarchy, positioned to either offer their gift or receive the gift of another. When this is our understanding of hierarchy it breeds the humility of recognizing that my gifts belong to those around me and that I, myself need the gifts of my brothers and sisters. According to St. Dionysios' teaching on hierarchy, no position within the order is of more value. All are properly placed for the exchange of blessings.





In our parish council meeting last month, we spent a lot of time talking about this exact concept. We asked ourselves what are the unique role and the gifts of the Parish Council which we are called to offer to the community of St. Athanasios. And we discussed the gifts that are present within our parish that can benefit the parish council. Ultimately, we arrived at the conclusion that God has positioned the Parish Council to offer its gifts in service to the community by putting greater energy into strategy, long-term planning, and tending to the character of the parish. We recognize that the Parish Council needs the unique talents of those parishioners who are uniquely positioned to offer their service tending to day to day operations.

With next month's upcoming General Assembly and Parish Council Elections, I would like to invite you to reach out and speak to me or Brian McAnally, our Parish Council President, if you are interested in offering your unique gifts in service either on the Parish Council or in any other capacity within the Church.



#### **STEWARDSHIP**

#### The Act of Generous Giving

Stewardship can feel awkward to some. It may provoke curiosity, introspection and even guilt. Where does this awkwardness come from? Is it because discussing money/treasures makes us feel uncomfortable because it's personal? We might suggest that when we connect this topic to the teachings of the Bible, it is more clear and less awkward. Let's commit to learning more.

Stewardship, Generosity and Giving are not synonymous. Stewardship is the act of being a Steward. Giving is an act, and Generosity is an attitude. Giving can be done without being generous, but you cannot be generous and not give.

Giving is a learned exercise, one that needs practice. We have heard Jesus say it is more blessed to give. Here is the "why" behind His statement: When you keep what you have, you will be blessed. The more you keep the more you have, the more you have the more you can spend on yourself, etc. If you give, on the other hand, two people will be blessed by "your" money—you and the recipient. Keeping blesses one—giving blesses two. Hence it is more blessed to give than to receive (keep). We do not discover the second blessing until we actually do it, and it is probable that the more we do it the more addictive giving becomes.

God is a giver, and it takes faith to be a generous giver. That may be why our relationship with money impacts our relationship with God. Money is an emotional topic, especially in times when people are struggling financially. Every time we give, we acknowledge that everything we have has been given to us by God. He is our lifeline, our source for everything. So when we give, we are pleasing Him by showing Him how we manage our finances and that we want to please Him.


We have discussed often about the totality of Stewardship being not only Treasures, but Time and Talent and that it comes from the heart. Let's dig deep, pray and understand the spiritual implications of our relationship to money and God. When we make God our highest priority, and we honor Him, it releases a spirit of love and triggers acts of Generosity.



#### CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

I hope you and your loved ones are all well and that you are enjoying the fall. Fall is my favorite time of year; the humidity is down, the air is crisp, and it is a chance to go outdoors and enjoy your favorite activity. One of my favorite activities is watching, in my opinion, the ultimate team sport, football. In football, every player on and off the field has a role to play in all three aspects of the game. The starting running back owes part of his success to the preparation he received from the athletes on the practice team. Many, many years ago I was told that football resembles life and I believe it does!

Along with football, the fall brings with it the beginning of the Ecclesiastical and ministry year. As Father Panagiotis so eloquently related in the September Champion, this ministry year our focus is on Hysechia, or Prayerful Stillness. In his Champion article Father also reminded us of the availability of the Reliquary for private reflection in the presence of the Saints. I have never used the Reliquary in this way but in the future, I may follow his suggestion.

I encourage you to take any avenue that works for you towards Prayerful Stillness. For me, I find the time before the Orthros when the church is relatively empty, surrounded by the iconography of the Saints, to be an ideal time for quiet reflection. Each Saint has a place and although they may not have been a central front of mind figure in the story they had a key role nevertheless. They were and are all part of the team!

As far as teams are concerned, I am happy to report that as of September 1, 2024, with the help of 76 very generous donors, in eight short months, we have raised \$140,262 towards our Phase One goal of \$200.000.

Within the overall Phase One goal, our 25 x 25 Campaign is off to a great start as well. You may recall that our goal was to get 100 additional donors to donate \$250 each. To date, 31 donors have answered the call and we have raised \$19,375 towards our goal of raising \$25,000 by 2025. We need an additional 69 donors to come forward and help us reach our goal; parish wide participation, in any amount, is just as important as dollars raised.

Like any good football team, we need to build on our strengths, and work on our challenges and get everyone off of the sidelines and into the game. I humbly ask that you take the time to contemplate your current and ongoing role within the Church and our beloved Saint Athanasios and how you can make a difference with the Capital Campaign and get off of the sideline and become part of the team that contributed to the ultimate goal of reaching the summit, "So that all may be saved and come to the knowledge of truth".




#### DISCOVER ORTHODOXY






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
