

"Come, let us rejoice in the Lord as we declare this present mystery. The middle wall of partition is broken asunder." (Vespers Hymn of Christmas)

On the Feast of Christmas, the Church proclaims that by coming down to us and becoming incarnate, God breaks down the "middle wall of partition" that existed between us. He in heaven and we on earth were separated from one another. With the fall of mankind, we lost the closeness we once had in Paradise where mankind dwelt in the presence of God. Thus, a wall existed between us, partitioning us off from one another. Since we could not retrace our path back to paradise, Christ broke through that wall so that once again God and man dwell together.


The use of the phrase "The middle wall of partition is broken asunder" is peculiar in this hymn. The hymnographer is referring to the partition between God and man. But the origin of this phrase comes from St. Paul's Epistle to the Ephesians (2:14). In that context, St. Paul is writing about the partition that existed between the gentiles and the commonwealth of Israel, quite literally a barrier in the temple that kept gentiles and Jews physically separated from one another. So, in addition to the middle wall of partition between God and man (hymn), Christ also breaks asunder the middle wall of partition between human beings (Ephesians 2:14).

Christmas is a celebration of union: union between God and man and also union among mankind. Christ establishes this union as we hear Him pray to the Father at the Mystical Supper, "The glory that You have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as We are one, I in them and You in Me, that they may be completely one" (John 17:22-23). Christmas Joy springs from union: us in God, God in us, and us one with each other.

We must be on guard that our hearts are never partitioned against God nor against our fellow man. This Christmas season, I pray that we join the work of Christ and break asunder the middle walls of partition that exist both in and around us. May the Joy and unity of Christ be with us as we celebrate along with the angels, "Glory to God in the highest, peace on earth, goodwill among men!" (Luke 2:14)



STEWARDSHIP

Thank You for your Generous Giving

On November 3 rd , the Stewardship Committee provided a Stewardship update at the Fall Parish Assembly. The update focused on two aspects our ongoing Stewardship initiatives ... a review our 2024 Campaign and an introduction to our 2025 Campaign. From a 2024 perspective, we have exceeded our 2024 Stewardship Goal ... THANK YOU for your Generous Giving!

The theme for our 2025 Stewardship Campaign is "Your Own from Your Own," from the Divine Liturgy as we offer back to God that which He has given us. He receives our humble offering of bread and wine and returns them to us as His Body and Blood in Holy Communion. You will learn more about this theme throughout 2025.

Your 2025 Pledge card will be sent to you in early December for completion or you can go on-line to complete it. We ask that you submit your 2025 commitment by mid-January. The 2025 Treasures Stewardship Goal is \$408,300, a \$58,300 or 15% increase over 2024. This would result in Stewardship covering 67% of our 2025 operating expenses. In 2024, Stewardship covered only 50% of our operating expenses. The remaining portion of our operating expenses is covered by external fundraising activities. We need to strive to a future position where Stewardship will cover 100% of our day-to-day operating expenses.

Our ask of you is to "listen to your heart" and to continue your Generous Giving of your Time, Talents, & Description of your Time, Talents, & Description of your 2025. Commitment by at least 15% in 2025.
